First Year Students Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

When should incoming students register with Access *Ability* Services? Students who have been newly admitted to the University of Toronto Scarborough (UTSC) and require accommodations should register with Access Ability Services as soon as the Letter of Offer is accepted. Students are strongly encouraged to register as early as possible to avoid a delay in service. To start the registration process, please complete the <u>Online Intake</u> <u>Form</u>. Visit our website for <u>more information about registering with</u> Access Ability Services and what documentation you will need to provide.

Will I receive the same accommodations at UTSC as I did in high school?Not necessarily. University is a very different environment from high school.As such, your previous accommodations may not be sufficient to support you in this environment or some supports may be delivered in a different fashion.

I have been accepted to U of T Scarborough based on special consideration. Will my documentation be forwarded to Access *Ability* Services?

Congratulations on your acceptance! Any documentation included with your university application will not be forwarded to Access *Ability* Services. Students are advised to provide the service with a separate copy. We strongly advise students to <u>register with Access *Ability* Services</u> as soon as possible upon acceptance of their offer of admission.

What financial supports are available to students with disabilities? There are a number of scholarships and bursaries available exclusively for students with disabilities. For more information or to book an appointment with a Financial Aid Advisor, please refer to the <u>UTSC Financial Aid</u> <u>Website</u>. Access to a number of the awards depends on OSAP eligibility. We strongly recommend that all students with disabilities apply for OSAP, even if they think they will not be eligible. An official decision must be made regarding OSAP eligibility before other sources of funding can be pursued.

Who will have access to my Access *Ability* Services records? Our records are confidential. Students will not be identified on their transcripts or degree as being registered with Access *Ability* Services.
