Working through an inclusive excellence lens, the ADEGL will provide leadership contributing to holistic and transformative learning opportunities for students, including the prioritization of expanded experiential learning opportunities at the University of Toronto Scarborough, enhancing opportunities for student mobility, and the expansion of local and global partnerships that are integrated in the curriculum.

Duties will include:

- Coordinating and adjudicating experiential learning (EL) funding for U of T Scarborough faculty;
- Supporting academic departments as they continue to strengthen and expand current EL opportunities, and develop new ways, suitable to their discipline, to enrich student learning, including through online formats;

- Providing leadership for EL-related committees and initiatives on campus (including the Experiential Learning Table and Steering Committee);
- Serving on tri-campus EL committees as needed;
- Providing academic oversight for the Arts and Science Co-Op Office and related work-integrated learning programming;
- Working with key campus stakeholders (including the Co-op Offices, the Centre for Teaching and Learning, Partnerships & Community Engagement, the Hub, the Bridge, and Academic Advising & Career Counselling, Access Ability Services, and the International Student Centre) to ensure clear communication and connection across different areas of experiential, work-integrated, and communitybased learning;
- Contributing to the ongoing development of guidelines and best practices for EL at U of T Scarborough;
- Assisting with the implementation of strategic planning areas related to EL;
- Contributing to the expansion of local and global partnerships that are integrated in the curriculum;
- Contributing to the development of international and intercultural curricular initiatives, including through global classrooms;
- Enhancing opportunities for student mobility, including through international course modules;
- Contributing to cross-portfolio conversations about international recruitment, initiatives, and student success
