Re: Professional Academic Coaching Fund (PACF) Call for Applications

As Vice-Dean Faculty Affairs, Equity & Success, I am pleased to provide the opportunity for Teaching Stream faculty to work with a professional academic coach this spring, through the Professional Academic Coaching Fund (PACF). The PACF supports pedagogical and professional achievement, and the success of Teaching Stream faculty at U of T Scarborough (UTSC) across a range of career stages, by providing access to professional academic coaching services. Academic coaches provide personalized support in areas such as, but not limited to, goal setting, work-life balance, productivity, leadership, network building, and career planning. I have recently had the invaluable experience of working with a coach to support my personal career goals, a practice that is very common in other professions and that is now starting to catch on in academia.^{1,2}

Each continuing track Teaching Stream faculty member at UTSC is eligible to receive one PACF of up to \$5,000. Successful applicants must submit an exit report including a detailed accounting of expenditures and complete a program satisfaction survey no later than 30 July 2022 (please do not disclose the content/substance of your meetings in these materials). Any funds not spent by this time will be pulled back to the Office of the Vice-Principal Academic & Dean. Please note that any sessions scheduled to take place by 31 August, but pre-paid by 30 July 2022, may proceed.

Applications will be accepted until **15 February 2022** or until funds are exhausted. Faculty can <u>register</u> their interest online by submitting the name of an academic coach they are interested in working with one-on-one, a proposed budget including the rate and anticipated number of sessions, as well as the desired area of focus for coaching sessions. A sample list of professional academic coaches, generated by a Google search, is below. Applicants are encouraged to explore these and other options to find a good fit for them.
