UTSC Departmental Research Fund (2018-2019) December 12, 2018

Background

The Office of the Vice-Principal Research (OVPR) consulted with UTSC Chairs and Directors (CAD) and the UTSC Research Advisory Board (RAB) during the spring of 2018 to identify new funding initiatives that aim to stimulate and support research activities across the diverse academic disciplines at UTSC. Based on feedback provided, the OVPR would like to propose a new UTSC Departmental Research Fund.

The Fund will provide Chairs and Directors an opportunity to request funding in 2018-2019 within one of the following funding envelopes available: (1) \$100,000 or (2) \$30,000. Up to a maximum of three \$100,000 requests and a maximum of three \$30,000 requests will be awarded in 2018-2019. Requests can be made to support one or more of the following initiatives based on departmental research priorities. There was general consensus from the CAD and RAB meetings that the below funding initiatives would benefit diverse research ambitions across departments. The program will be assessed after this first year of implementation.

Funding Initiatives

1. Research to Knowledge Mobilization and Commercialization (R2K)

Funding to support proposals that move research to community impact or product development. These funds can include partnering meetings, community events, hiring staff to commercialize products, and so on. Researchers should be encouraged to identify if there is an opportunity to leverage these funds for partnership granting programs.

2. Interdisciplinary Challenge Fund (ICF)

Funding to support interdisciplinary proposals. The research must explicitly use expertise from distinct disciplines to create new understanding or solutions to address societal, technological, or environmental problems. Proposals can be within the same department or across two or more UTSC departments. Proposals should identify potential funding programs to help grow the interdisciplinary project.

3. Research Infrastructure and Equipment Fund (RIEF)

A pool of funds for faculty to purchase new or replace faulty or obsolete equipment (for faculty that were unsuccessful applying for an NSERC Research Tools and Instruments Grant the year prior), or to service or repair existing equipment.

4. Undergraduate Summer Research Opportunity (USRO)

Funding to support undergraduate summer research experience by providing funding to outstanding undergraduate students to work on faculty research projects. The University of Toronto Research Excellence Awards program guidelines should be used to administer this opportunity.

How to Apply

- 1. Chairs or Directors are asked to submit a memo (maximum of three pages) to the OVPR outlining:
 - a. A request for funding including the funding envelope being requested and budget for the allocation of funds
 - b. Details on which one or more of the funding initiatives the funds will be used for
 - c. How the requested funds meet the department or centre's overall research strategy
 - d. How the funds and initiative proposed will enhance research excellence in the department or centre
- The submission deadline is February 15 (should that date fall on a weekend or public holiday, the submission deadline will be 5pm the next business day). - 3. Chairs and Directors will review all requests and funding will be dispersed to successful Departments and/or Centres the end of March

Accountability

A brief final report (maximum of two pages) describing what was accomplished with the Departmental Funds including the outcomes and impact of the funding on faculty research in the department/centre. The final report is due February 15 of the year following the February 1st competition. Should February 15 fall on a weekend or public holiday, the submission deadline will be 5pm the next business day).
