Further to the [memorandum of 26 November 2021](#), the University of Toronto introduced **Multi-Factor Authentication (UTORMFA)** as part of its continuing effort to protect faculty and staff, their data, and the university. UTORMFA adds an extra layer of security to the login process, enabling faculty and staff to work remotely with confidence. Over the past year approximately 40% of faculty members at U of T Scarborough have enrolled in UTORMFA.

The current geo-political situation has amplified the need to leverage all the tools at our disposal to mitigate security risks. UTORMFA has been rolled out successfully for all staff and is now being rolled out for all appointed faculty members.

Faculty can self-enroll in UTORMFA by following these [steps](#). It takes 10 minutes to enroll and could have a significant impact on ensuring the security of data and that of the university. Faculty that have not enrolled by **13 May 2022**, will be added to the auto-enrollment process (running between 16 May - 15 June 2022) to ensure that faculty and the university remain protected. At that point, faculty will need to be enrolled in UTORMFA to access university systems. For more information - [UTORMFA faculty webpage](#).
