There will be three multiple choice term test during the academic year. Each test is

worth 20 percent of your final grade. The tentative dates for these tests are as follows.

For all three section, all term test will be held at 5 pm. Term test 1 and 2 will be held in the Gym. The locations for the test 3 will be announced later in the academic year. Each student is required to bring an HB pencil and their student ID card to all term tests and the final exam. Term tests may cover all material assigned or covered by the instructor during lectures.

A final multiple choice examination, worth 40 percent of your final grade, will be held at the close of the academic year. The final examination will be based primarily on the textbook (Psychology by Gleitman). This includes the introduction and the appendices on research methods and statistics.

Volunteer participation as a subject in ongoing psychological research can earn a student up to 3 bonus points (an addition 3 percent).

#### **IMPORTANT**

If a change in lecture section is desired, it first should be attempted with the phone-in number at the Registrars's office. If a student *NEEDS* to change to change lecture section and is unable to do so through the Registrar's office, he or she must request a change from Dr. Bors — not the instructor. Most sections are full and fire regulations (room capacities) must be obeyed, thus section changes are difficult to arrange.

- -- The last day to change lecture sections is September 22, 1995.
- -- The last day to withdraw from the course, without academic penalty, is February 16, 1996.

-- Any administrative problems concerning the term tests should be addressed to the TA during her office hours.

Make-up tests are not given without legitimate reasons. Under most circumstances, the student is required to present a medical certificate if a test is missed due to illness. The certificate must state that, IN THE PHYSICIAN'S OPINION, you are unable to write the test, not just that you were examined for a particular complaint. DO NOT phone your instructor or dr. Make -up tests (for all sections) will given at 5 pm on the Wednesday of the week following the original date of the test. The location of the make-up term tests will be posted on the door or room S-540C the afternoon of the make-up. If the make-up test is also missed for legitimate reasons, a grade will be assigned based on the student's relative performance on the other two term test and the fianl exam. Make-ups for the final exam are entirely in the hands of the college's Subcommittee on Standing.

- 2. If you wish to go over questions on the term test, make arrangements with your instructor.

- 4. Students who believe that an error may have occurred in the calculation of their final grade may request a recalculation through the Office of the Registrar. DO NOT DIRECTLY CONTACT YOUR INSTRUCTOR OR THE COORDINATOR.
- 5. As describe in the college calendar, there are differences between scores or marks and grades. Although final grades are based on approved grade scales, your cummulative scores may not be directly identified with your final grade.
