Students will select seminar topic and will obtain instructor's approval by <u>Jan 21, 1998.</u>

Student will develop and analyze reading list in weekly meeting with instructor. An evaluation of this process will be provided to the student by March 6, 1998 (10% of course). Students will lead a seminar presentation of topic on March 25, 1998 (20% of course). Students will provide a short list of readings to other members of class two weeks before seminar. A 10-page (2500 wd) analytical paper on chosen topic is due on the last day of class (April 8, 1998) (40% of course). Final (date TBA, using short essay questions, 30% of course) will cover topics of seminar. Students will be responsible for answering questions on topics other than his/her own.
