**Course Overview**

This course covers research methodology in social psychology, including learning about specific techniques, such as attitude measurement, and also, more general principles of design and methodology. There will be two class projects, intended to give you first-hand experience with research approaches used in social psychological research.

For these classes in the Computer Lab, you need a UTSC student account (same one as you would need to access the UTSC intranet). Please be sure your account is active before the first session in B 494.

**Evaluation**

For each of the two class projects, there is a paper based on the project. You will receive detailed information about the project and the format for the paper based on each project during the term. In addition, there will be one examination, covering the required reading in your text throughout the entire term, as well as material presented in class during the entire term. This examination will take place during the final exam period. The exam format will include multiple choice questions and also, essay questions.
