Course Description:

Why can we remember the names of people in our first grade class but not know where we parked our car? Why do our eyes sometimes see things that aren't there? How is the brain organized? How do we see the things we see? How is affect and cognition related? Do emotions affect our recall of memories? The purpose of this course is to stimulate curiosity about both the content and the process of cognitive psychology. Cognitive psychology is an experimental field. In this course there will be a focus on the experiments that have led to theories about how we think. This course also provides an analysis of the research on encoding, storage and retrieval of information in human memory. Also surveyed are the related topics of cognition, memory and emotion interactions, the emotional unconscious, affect, memory and social cognition, attention, thinking, and problem solving.
