Attendance: Students are expected to attend every class meeting.

This paper is worth 30% of the final grade.

Final Exam: Students will complete a multiple-choice and short-answer essay exam during finals week (date TBA). The exam will not exceed two hours. This exam will be worth 40% of the final grade.

Policies

Makeup exams: A makeup exam will be held approximately one week after the regularly schedule exam at a time and date to be determined. Students will be permitted to write a deferred midterm exam only in the event that they are unable to appear on the day of the exam due to a verified illness, a serious family emergency (e.g., a death in the family), or religious observances. With respect to absences due to illness, please note that students will only be permitted to write a deferred exam if they provide a valid UTSC Medical Certificate. The medical certificate must indicate: (a) that the student sought medical attention on the day of the exam (not the day before or after), (b) the nature/timeline of the student's problem and the diagnostic tests that were performed, and (c) how the problem prevented the student from writing the regularly scheduled midterm exam. Medical certificates must be signed by the physician and include his or her contact information in order to be considered valid. Students will be required to submit their medical certificates for verification before they will be permitted to write the deferred midterm exam.
